Dear parent/guardian,

Welcome to the Chosen Confirmation program at St. Raphael Catholic church! Thank you for choosing St. Raphael and getting your child registered for Faith Formation. This packet will contain everything you need to know about our program as well as paperwork that will need to be filled out and turned in for our records. The following is a brief description about the Chosen program:

“Church leaders, catechists, parents, and—most importantly—teens themselves have acclaimed Chosen as an engaging, fun, and life changing experience. In just its first year of release, this award-winning program has been implemented in thousands of parishes around the country. Chosen calls teens to a personal encounter with Jesus Christ and is designed to answer the Church’s call for a New Evangelization, offering a new approach to youth catechesis and sacramental preparation.”

The most important thing we can do through this program as teachers, leaders, and parents is to make sure our young church have that personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Our mission is the same as the Great Commission found in the gospel of Matthew (28:16-20) when Jesus told His apostles to go out and make Disciples. We want to be Disciples and to make Disciples of Christ.

Confirmation is the third and final sacrament of initiation that completes the grace we receive from baptism. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “by the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed.” (CCC 1285).

Our program at St. Raphael Catholic Church divides the students into small groups of around 15 that will meet in the homes of our catechists on Sunday afternoons or Sunday nights. We try our best to accommodate requests based on location or catechist preference, but unfortunately it may just not be possible to accommodate everybody. We start our confirmation preparation in the 8th grade and continue until the candidates are confirmed in the fall of their sophomore year in high school. They will meet approximately every other Sunday from October to May; however there will be other events through the program that may not fall into that timeframe.

Please utilize the parent’s guide and follow along with your teen through the Chosen program. This journey is not meant to be traveled alone! The parents and the teen’s sponsor should be walking and praying with the candidate on this journey and throughout the entire program. If you have any questions or concerns please feel free to contact our office at any time. Thank you!

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Chosen Confirmation Program Completion Guide

PLEASE KEEP THIS GUIDE FOR YOUR RECORDS

- 1. REGISTER FOR THE PROGRAM EACH YEAR VIA ONLINE REGISTRATION.** Please register in May. Please also fill out the Sacramental Information Form to turn in with 8th grade registration.

- a. 8th grade
- b. Freshman year
- c. Sophomore year

- 2. ATTEND AND PARTICIPATE IN THE SMALL GROUP AND LARGE GROUP GATHERINGS**

- a. Attendance will be taken for each small group and large group event.
- b. Participation while at small group is very important. We want the confirmandi to be actively engaged in the discussions, prayer, icebreakers, etc. They should be completing the work in the student workbook, doing the challenges, and their reading.
- c. Large group gatherings will most likely include parents and/or sponsors.
- d. **ATTENDANCE POLICY:** If an SCC session is missed, that person is responsible for checking out the DVD from the Youth Faith Formation Office to make it up within a week's time. If four or more classes are missed, the catechist will notify the director who will then contact the family and come to a resolution to make up the missed time. It may also be determined whether or not the student should continue in the program.
*MISSING FIVE OR MORE CLASSES COULD RESULT IN NEEDING TO REPEAT THE YEAR.

- 3. CONFIRMATION SPONSOR FORM**

- a. To be turned in as soon as possible. (At least by the end of 8th grade)
- b. The parish seal of the sponsor's parish must be present on the form.
- c. Please see page 21 in the Parent's Guide for details on how to choose a sponsor.
- d. We want the sponsor to be involved right away and throughout the confirmation journey. Please be sure they receive the Chosen Sponsor's Guide.
- e. The sponsor form is included in this packet.

- 4. CONFIRMATION NAME FORM**

- a. Please turn this form by September of sophomore year.
- b. The confirmation or saint name can be any saint that is recognized as such by the Catholic Church or can be the student's birth name so long as it is a Christian name.
- c. The name should be as of same gender as the person choosing it.
- d. Research on the history of the saint is highly encouraged so that the saint chosen is meaningful to the confirmandi. Example: if the confirmandi loves animals they might choose the patron saint of animals (St. Francis of Assisi).

5. SAINT REPORT

- a. This one page paper should be turned in by September of sophomore year.
- b. Please be sure that the paper is clearly marked and has the confirmandi's name on it.
- c. The directions for the paper are included in this packet.
- d. This report does not necessarily have to be on the same saint that was chosen for the confirmation name though it is recommended.

6. LETTER TO PASTOR

- a. This one page letter should be turned in by the end of September in the sophomore year of high school.
- b. Directions for the letter are included in this packet.

7. ATTEND A REFLECTIONS CONFIRMATION RETREAT

- a. Currently, there are two retreats offered for the confirmation program. One will be in the freshman year of the program (usually in February) and the other will be as a sophomore (September/October).
- b. The Reflections Retreat is a vital part of the confirmation journey and should be attended by all in the program except for a serious concern or major conflict. School dances and sports games are not considered a valid excuse to miss the retreat.
- c. The retreat is a weekend away at Dickson Valley Retreat Center in Newark, IL.
- d. Once a student has participated in a Reflections Retreat, they are welcomed back to be a leader for future retreats.
- e. Please contact Chris with any concerns or if there is a major conflict.

8. COMPLETE 15 HOURS OF SERVICE (OVER THE COURSE OF TWO YEARS)

- a. Each small group will participate in Harvest Sunday which will count for about 2 hours or more per Sunday. The first Sunday is distributing the flyers and then the next week will be collecting food.
- b. Each small group should strive to do a service outing as a small group. These will vary depending on what your small group leaders and small group decide.
- c. Other opportunities for service would include but are not limited to:
 - i. Packing food at Feed My Starving Children
 - ii. Preparing and serving a meal at Hesed House
 - iii. Attending our annual Mission Trip in the summer
 - iv. Volunteering at a nursing home
 - v. Doing yard work, shoveling snow, cleaning, or home repairs for a neighbor/Other. (At your own house would not count for this)

- vi. Serving at church functions like doughnut Sunday, the parish picnic, the confirmation reception, Vacation Bible School/Totus Tuus leader, office help, etc.
- d. The form to be filled out with each service event is included in this packet.

9. RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION AT LEAST ONCE EACH YEAR IN THE PROGRAM

- a. There will be a reconciliation service offered each year in the Confirmation Program that students are expected to attend.
- b. If it's not possible to attend the reconciliation service, other days for confession include special Parish Reconciliation Services during Lent and Advent or on Saturdays between 4-4:45pm.
- c. Parents/Guardians and sponsors are all invited to the services.

10. CONFIRMATION REHEARSAL

- a. The confirmandi AND sponsor need to be present at the rehearsal. This will typically take place around a week before confirmation.
- b. If a sponsor should live out of town or is unable to make the rehearsal, a proxy is welcome to take their place at the rehearsal to relay all of the necessary information to the sponsor before the ceremony.



SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION FOR CONFIRMATION

We need each family to fill out the Sacramental Information Form in preparation for the forwarding of this information to the baptizing parish. Please complete the form below completely and accurately. Information from this form will be placed onto the legal records of the baptizing parish.

Before each teen is confirmed, it is necessary to verify that he/she has been baptized as a Catholic Christian. A copy (if you have the original, a photocopy is sufficient) of the teen's baptismal certificate needs to be turned into the Youth Ministry office along with this form. If you do not have your child's baptismal certificate, you will need to obtain one from the baptizing parish. Call or write directly to the baptizing parish's office; there may be a fee or stipend. If your youth was baptized at St. Raphael, no certificate is needed.

CONFIRMATION NAME

In both the Old and New Testament whenever God had a new mission for a person, that person received a new name, e.g. Jacob/Israel. Even without a name change, your name always stood for who you were.

Baptism/Confirmation sends each of us on a mission to go into whatever world we live in and to build God's kingdom there. While all initiated Christians have that general mission, God calls each one of us to a particular mission that no one else can accomplish. These may be "doing" missions (convert non-believers, starting a soup kitchen) but they may also be "being" missions (be the peacemaker in every situation, be the courageous one when everyone else is weak).

It is currently recommended in the church that the candidate use his/her baptismal name as their Confirmation name because of the close connection between these two sacraments of initiation. However, you may select a new name if you wish. In choosing a Confirmation name, determine whether your baptismal name does reflect that special mission to which you feel God calls you. Your Confirmation name should be the name of a saint you admire or wish to imitate.

> Choose a Patron Saint (it might be the one you chose for your Confirmation name or another with special meaning to you).

> Research the life of that saint.

> Write a one page paper on your saint. Include in your paper the answers to the following questions:

1. What are some of the significant things this saint did in his/her life? What are they best known for?
2. Why did you choose to write about this saint?
3. How can you strive to live like this saint in your everyday life?

LETTER TO THE PASTOR

Each candidate will prepare a formal letter of request for reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation. The letter of request will be presented to the Pastor. You will address your letter to Fr. Dan. The content of the letter should be in your own words. You should indicate why you want to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and how you have prepared for the reception of the sacrament. Tell the Pastor how your faith has grown and who and what helped you in that growth process. Mention who your sponsor is and why you chose that person. Also indicate your Confirmation name and what significance that name has for you. Finally, relate to the Pastor how you are going to participate in the life of the church and contribute to the building up of God's Kingdom after Confirmation.

The letter should be prepared with respect for the Pastor, that is, on clean stationery or paper (not on loose leaf paper or sheets torn out of a tablet). It should be written neatly or typed, printed, and signed by the candidate. Please place the letter in an envelope marked 'Letter to the Pastor' with the candidate's name in the lower corner of the envelope.
